## Class VI: Autumn Bounty

A collection of fruits or vegetables in a container or basket not larger than 24 " in any diameter. Must be grown by member. Key card required.

## Class VII: Culinary Delight

Member made preserves, relishes, pickled items, cookies, etc.
Pleasingly displayed with enough samples for the judges to critique.

Judged against perfection rather than against other exhibits (each on its own merits). Only exhibits that do not qualify for other classes in the schedule may be shown in the Par class.

Par Scoring System
A. 90-100 = First - blue ribbon
B. $85-89=$ Second - red ribbon
C. $80-84=$ Third - yellow ribbon
